My dear Parishioners,

When we say someone has their head in the clouds we're used to thinking that they're not much use. *'Too heavenly minded, no earthly use...'* we say, *'Day dreamers without much concern for the rest of us'*.

Moses is described today as being in the clouds. Indeed the Lord came to him in a cloud, his head was literally in the clouds. And this was the most powerful experience for Moses and indeed all those associated with him, especially those seventy elders. So powerful was his experience that it even seems to rub off on Eldad, Medad and sundry other dads for that matter!

The facts are that Moses, with head in the clouds, renews and revives the community precisely because he had had his head in the clouds.

What had happened there? Clearly he had been singled out, set aside to be God's agent. And then he had been covered with a most extraordinary power. He had been touched by something over and above the

natural order. In all this he had been able to pass on what he had received.

This story of Moses is rich with insight for our own lives. When we say we are called by God it is not so much that we think we're elite but rather that we're chosen for some purpose. Called by the God whom we meet in Jesus, through the Church and the sacraments, in our prayer in the mysteries of the faith. The God whom one day we shall see face to face with an unclouded clarity. Called, touched by the power which is grace, and unable to contain the life of God in us: we have to share. And the sharing will come in many ways. The sharing of good fortune or lots of energy or an act of kindness or a prayer for somebody's well-being, sharing of faith itself, because the Spirit has fallen on us.

And it is this Spirit which, if we want it, enables us to rise above the things of this life to which we can become so attached, over attached, and the sins which can drag our whole lives down. And then in that Spirit our lives find new focus not in the clouds themselves but beyond the clouds to the life of Heaven.

When somebody asked a newly ordained priest recently whether he found it difficult to commit his life, his whole life to celibacy and to priesthood he answered that, 'Well it was just a lifetime'. The things of this life do pass away, that's a fact! The things of heaven last for ever, that's our faith.

The emphasis this year is helping communities who are directly affected by the climate change crisis. Examples are :-

- providing solar powered pumps to supply water to villages for use of people for personal use plus watering livestock and irrigating crops
- help people to thrive by providing long term skills, tools and opportunities to live with dignity, support their families and give back to their communities
- be there for people in crisis – natural disasters, war, or changes in employment – no fish left for fishermen to catch; permanent drought affects type of crops that can be grown;
- climate concerns – grow different crops more suited to changing conditions
- regenerate land and return it to its original use for example Ivanilde in Brazil. Her lands were burnt by ranches to provide more grazing for beef cattle.
- Ivanilde lives in one of the most heavily deforested regions of the Brazilian Amazon. Her land has been ravaged by forest fires more than once. She’s watched plants and trees that she’s spent so long caring for burn to the ground. These are the crops her family rely on to earn a living.
- But she has never given up.

- With the help of local experts from our Church network, Ivanilde has replanted and rebuilt. She continues to stand tall, being the guardian of the rainforest she loves.
