My dear Parishioners

Seventy years ago, King George VI died and his daughter became Queen Elizabeth II. There are days in June set aside to celebrate the Queen's Platinum Jubilee – days that mark the anniversary of her Coronation – but tomorrow is the anniversary of the Day of her Accession.

Writing in *The Telegraph*, Charles Moore uses this anniversary to reflect on 'gratitude'. The springboard for his article is the expression of gratitude that most of us would want to convey to the Queen. And, in this, Charles Moore encourages us not to wait until June! The Queen is alive today, but she will be 96 in April.

The sorts of personal qualities for which the Queen is generally admired have been well-rehearsed, and Moore alights on two of them, that would (in all probability) be right up there at the top of the list of the things for which we would want to give thanks: her service (which, we know has been tireless) and her faith (which we know is deep, and real, and personal).

There is an interesting connection between faith and service in a prayer which Her Majesty will undoubtedly offer tomorrow, from the Book of Common Prayer of the Church of England. It's a prayer of 'general thanksgiving', crafted in the beautiful language of another age, in which the 'unworthy servant' asks God to give 'that due sense of all thy mercies, that our hearts may be

unfeignedly thankful, and that we may shew forth thy praise, not only with our lips, but in our lives, by giving up ourselves to thy service...'

The underlying truth of the prayer is that only if you can be humble enough to give thanks, can you also give service. For the giving of thanks, rooted in a proper sense of reliance on another (in the case of the prayer, a reliance upon God) promotes a disposition that orders us towards the other, and not towards self.

The Queen knows that her lifelong role does not spring from merit, but (rather) from 'accident of birth', from the abdication of her uncle, and from the death of her father. She knows that she is (as the 'General Thanksgiving' puts it) an 'unworthy servant' – and as such (as we learnt from that intimate Christian portrait of her, published under the title 'The Queen and the King she serves') – as such, she is one trying every day to be worthier, the better to serve.

We know the Queen is grateful to her father for first showing her this quality. And on this anniversary of his death, he is probably in her first waking thought. But we know, too, that, because of her faith, the model she *also* holds before her is not only that of her father, the late King, but also her Father in heaven.
